Mark 9:30-41

Overview

The Gospel calls for the Son of Man to be Delivered for the Mission

- Jesus pulls away and carefully sequesters and teaches Gospel to Disciples
 - Knows these disciples and the proper understanding of this message was dependent upon the advancement of the Kingdom
 - This Kingdom was the establishment of the people and the world He had wanted from the beginning (Gen.)
- If Jesus is Delivered, there must be a Deliverer and He is God the Father
 - He is being delivered as part of a plan from eternity past to set up the
- Kingdom, the world God had always wanted, He did not give up
 - We must see the necessity of the Son of Man to be delivered up
 - Overcome death that sin brought in
 - This was accomplished through the resurrection
 - W/o resurrection. Jesus is no different than other "good teachers"
- Disciples don't get it and are afraid to ask questions

The Gospel calls us to be servants in the Mission

- Evidence of the Disciples not getting the Gospel is their jockeying for position of some political kingdom
 - If they properly understood the Gospel they would understand true greatness
- True Greatness is seeing yourself as last of all, servant of all
 - Placing others as more important than yourself
 - Not just people who can do things for us, but all peoples
 - This is reflected in example of child
 - Child is vulnerable, needy, no status, etc.
 - We must serve all, therein is true greatness
 - Humility is true greatness

The Gospel calls us to be unified in the Mission

- Disciples continue to illustrate their lack of understanding the Gospel in their trying to stop someone doing good work in the name of Christ
- Those who are for Christ are not against Christ
- As the Mission of God advances, those who hold to that one true Gospel should lock arms to advance the Gospel that God would have a people for Himself
