

A Biblical View of Sex Proverbs 5

<u>Main Idea</u>

Treating sex as God intends satisfies more than lust ever gives.

<u>Overview</u>

I. God's Standard Not Man's (vv. 21-23)

- We must evaluate sex and lust according to God's standard not man's standard; God is the Creator; he creates all things and he creates order, or rules for those things. (v. 21)=
- God's rules are for our good
 - 1: Just as a train only runs on the tracks for which it was designed, God has laid tracks on which we are designed to run and we have the greatest joy when we are living in God's world according to God's Word.
 - 2: God's rules remind us that we fall short of what God demands and this it points us to the one who did not fall short, Jesus
- Following our own rules leads to us ""to be ensnared and held fast to the cord of our sin and to death."

II. Lust leads to shallow satisfaction and regret (vv. 3-14)

- The forbidden woman represents anything lustful lust is craving sexually what God has forbidden
- Lust leads to shallow satisfaction
 - What is forbidden is enticing sweet as honey, smooth as oil
 - What is forbidden is shallow Lust drips honey but ends up being bitter; lust has smooth speech, but ends up being sharper than a two-edge sword. Lust does not provide what it promises.
 - One of Satan's greatest devices to draw the soul to sin is to present the bait and hide the hook
- Lust leads to regret
 - Lust leads to death (primarily spiritual), robs your honor, causes you to waste your life, be taken advantage of by strangers
 - A life filled with lust is a life filled with regret, that causes you to look back on your life with a long list of "If only..."

II. A Biblical View of Sex leads to Superior Satisfaction in Christ

- The best way to fight lust is not by saying "No" to bad things, but by saying "Yes" to the best things, those that point to God himself
- Biblical sex is exclusive sex in the context of marriage use of "own" in verses 15-17
 - \circ $\;$ God designed sex to be exclusive because the affects of sex are permanent
 - \circ $\;$ Because sex is not just something you do, it's who you are
- Biblical sex is pleasurable use of wholesome, rich, sexual language in verses 18-19

- What about those who are single? How do they find superior satisfaction in something they cannot participate in?
 - Treating sex as God intends, not necessarily participating in, but treating sex as God intends satisfies more than lust gives. Why?
 - Lust gives temporary satisfaction, where as holding to a biblical view of sex, even as a single person, brings eternal satisfaction because it points to the one who is eternally satisfying, Jesus Christ
 - The superior satisfaction that comes from biblical sex is eternal, not because of something on the physical level, but because of something on the spiritual level
 - The sexual intimacy reflected in marriage points to the intimacy Christ has for his bride, the church – and because this is taught objectively in Scripture, Hosea, Ezekiel, and Ephesians 5 among other places, not subjectively learned through experience, it can be grasped by both married couples and those who are single.
