Introduction to Acts

- o Written 62-64AD by Luke: Author/Doctor/Theologian/Missionary: Colossians 4.14
 - Luke 1.1-4 Purpose of writing
 - Type of Literature: Narrative
 - Talking to eyewitnesses and ministers of the word
- Placement between Gospels and Epistles makes it a Bridge of history of how the Gospel advanced
 - 1st Volume (Luke): Told all Jesus did personally/publically on earth as He taught what he accomplished by a bloody cross and an empty tomb
 - 2nd Volume (Acts): Writes of ministry from heaven exercised through the Holy Spirit by apostles

Believe the Gospel and receive the power of the Holy Spirit

- Jesus presented alive after sufferings: Sufferings were his scourging and sufferings on Cross,
 His death, and then his being alive is His triumph over said sufferings by the resurrection from the dead
 - Jesus living the sinless life and taking the punishment for our sin makes it possible to have sinners be reconciled to their God
- Jesus taught on Kingdom of God: Told them to wait for the Spirit that was foretold
 - Kingdom is not a geopolitical kingdom (vs. 6)
- o Power of the Spirit: Its ability to regenerate, to cleanse the sinful heart
 - Ezekiel 11.19-20

You must believe the one true Gospel

- Apostle: Messenger of the King
- Jesus establishing a New Kingdom
 - Old Covenant people were established with 12 tribes
 - New Covenant Kingdom that would not fail likewise began w/ 12 people
 - Judas replaced because of betrayal, not be he died
- Three qualifications of what it means to be an apostle: (seen in their replacing Judas)
 - Had to have been with Jesus during time on earth (Acts 1.21-22)
 - Had to be witnesses to resurrection (vs. 22)
 - Had to be appointed by the Lord (vs. 24)
- Apostles had been taught and made clear what the message was to carry to the world
 - Confession of Peter was "keys of the Kingdom" to carry (Matt. 16.16-20)
 - Apostles handled the "keys" and were able to confirm the Gospel as it advanced
- Christ is clearly interested in a pure Gospel, not what we want to believe about Christ

Christ's Kingdom is for the World

- Acts 1.8: Table of contents to book of Acts
- God wants a people for Himself from the beginning and now because of the work of Christ, it is possible for God to have that people through his obedience in death, burial, and resurrection for sinners
 - Christ previously said to be quiet, now He wants it to advance b/c the Good news is complete

- 8. How can we be sure we have the "keys to the Kingdom?" (Matt. 16.16-20)
- 9. Why is Christ so interested in advancing this Gospel into all the world?
- 10. Where is your struggle in advancing this message?
