- Sharing Sacrificial Affection: 4:10; 4:17-18; 1:6-7
 - Inspires potential missionaries
- Sharing Triumphant Joy: 4:1; 4:4; 1:3-5; 1:18; 2:2; 2:18
 - Stimulates worship

Questions

- 1. Read Phil. 1:3-11; 19. How do we see a reciprocal prayer relationship and why is that important?
- 2. What potential impact might this have on a Restoration Church corporately, and you personally? What impact might this have on the church planter/missionary?
- 3. How do we sustain vibrant, specific prayers for one another?
- 4. Read Phil. 1:12-18, 1:27-2:4, 4:2-3. Paul & the church at Philippi share personal information. How would sharing personal information "change your identity?"
- 5. *Read Phil. 4:14-18*. What are some ways Restoration Church is financially supporting global church planting?
- 6. Read 2:17-18; 4:10, 17-18. Why does it matter if we share affections and joy? (this is not about you, but the kingdom). How do we foster the sharing of affections and joy?
