# You've Been Sent

### Main Idea

For God So loved that world that He sent His son as a sacrifice, that whoever believes in Him would not perish but have everlasting life through union with God.

# **Overview**

- What is the manner in which we have been sent?
  - o John 17.18: "As" Father sent the son, "So" Son sends us (17.20)
    - Father sent the Son in Love: John 3.16
      - Love was an unconditional Love
      - Love that was sent towards sinners (Romans 5.8)
  - Father also sent the Son to sacrifice (John 17.19 & 20.20-21)
    - Jesus "consecrates" (gives Himself up)
    - Jesus shows holes in hands and side then commissions
      - Sacrifice is necessarily connected to the commissioning
- What is the purpose in the sending? What is it He "sent" us to do?
  - Jesus prayed specifically for us (today) & commissioned us: John 17.18
  - This commissioning sits in between the sanctification of the word (John 17.17, 19)
    - Part of the sending entails the telling of words that bring sanctification
    - That sanctification is eternal life
      - Eternal life is knowing God and the Son He sent: John 17.3
  - With the Believing of this word and the coming of life we are reconciled to God: John 17.11b, 20-23
    - The Good news of the Gospel is the union, the Oneness with God
- As the Father sent Jesus in sacrificial love to redeem a wayward people for Himself, so we are sent into our context in the same way to see people come back into fellowship with God for His glory

## **Questions**

Discussion starter: Do you know anyone/anything else that is sent on a mission? Is there a "manner" to their mission? Is their mission clear? Can you see it?

1. How did the Father send the Son? ("As") Point out places in the Scriptures that show these ways.

- 2. "So" how can we be loving & sacrificial in our being sent?
- 3. Read 17:20. Christ did not only commission his the disciples, but also us. What does it look like to "live sent?"
- 4. How does the world speak of eternal life?
- 5. Read 17:3. According to Scripture, what is "eternal life?" (John 17.3) How does this inform the WAY in which we speak the Gospel? How does this inform the Christian Life?
- 6. Why is Jesus so interested in us knowing/believing that the Father sent the Son? (John 17.3b, 8b, 18, 23b, 25b)
- 7. What is the mission of God and why does being sent demand words? (John 17.17, 19)
- 8. Why is Jesus so interested in our being one with God? (John 11b, 21-23)
- 9. Discuss the freedom and beauty of this God that He would want to share His glory and love with we sinners. (John 17.22-26)

Accountability: In what ways are you either being obedient or disobedient in living a life that is "sent" by God? What is the motive behind each action?
