

Shadows to Substance

Colossians 2.16-23

Main Idea

Adding rules to the Gospel cannot stop sin, only holding fast to Christ and Him alone can satisfy.

Overview

I. Self Made Religion Will Never Satisfy You

- In light of the 2.13-15, we see the "Therefore"
 - Since Christ defeated all the rulers & authorities & put them to open shame...therefore do not submit to anything that is added to His work to attempt to stop the thing He died to defeat
- Because of the Sufficiency of Christ's Atonement: Let no one judge you according to what food you
 eat or what you drink
- Because of the Sufficiency of Christ's Atonement: Let no one judge you according to a festival, new moon, or Sabbath
 - This is likely short hand for all the 1T laws
 - Paul says of these things that they were only shadows and Christ is the substance of these laws
 - All the laws pointed to Him...He is the fulfillment of them
 - No one should judge the practice or non-practice of these laws because Christ fulfilled them
- No one should also be disqualified on the basis of:
 - o Ascetism: Removal from the things of this world to be made more holy
 - Worship of Angels
 - o Going on in details about visions
 - Puffed up w/o reason by his sensuous mind
 - Paul has taught us that those in Christ are already qualified in receiving the share of the inheritance of the saints in light (1.12-13)
- Colossians teaches the Christian that they died to the world, so they shouldn't submit to rules made by man as they perish (2.20-22)
 - They may appear wise, but they cannot stop sin (2.23)
 - This is what we need the most
 - This is what Christ accomplished

II. Hold Fast to Christ Alone & Find Satisfaction in Him

- Christ is the Head of the Body
 - o By Him ALL things have nourishment and grow
- As opposed to growth by human teaching...holding fast to Christ alone creates a growth that comes from God
 - Holding fast to Christ only will give you true growth that never dies as it comes from God

Questions

- 7. Read verse 17 again. What does it mean "shadows" and "substance"? Can you give some examples of how Christ is the substance of the OT shadows?
- 8. How is it holding fast to Christ gives growth to the body that is from God?
- 9. What does this "holding fast to Christ" look like in the day to day?
- 10. Where are some other places in Colossians 1 and 2 that discuss the Sufficiency of Christ?
