

Gods Pleasure in His People

Psalm 147.10-11

Overview

God does not take pleasure in self-sufficiency (Ps. 14.7.10)

- The Lord gathers "outcasts" (v 2), the "brokenhearted (v 3), and He looks to the "humble" (v 6)
- He determines the numbers of stars and gives names to all of them (v 4)
- He is great and abundant in power and His understanding is beyond measure (v 5)
- He covers the heavens with clouds, prepares rain for the earth, makes grass grow, and gives beasts their food (v 9)
- In short God is pleased to be both a God that is Sovereign, yet also glad to serve
- Vs. 10 describes why God then does not delight in the strength of horses or the legs of man
 - Each of these are things that work against what the author is trying to do because they are things that man trusts in opposition to the Lord who is Sovereign and Serving

God takes pleasure in a Dependant People: (Ps. 147.11)

- God takes pleasure in those who fear Him
 - This connotes the idea of AWE while not negating the necessary fear that sinful people would have in the face of a Holy God (Isaiah 6)
- God takes pleasure in those who hope in His steadfast love
 - Hope here means trust, not "hope" like we hope it doesn't rain
 - The greatest expression of God's steadfast love is found in the Gospel
 - Those who know of their need for the Gospel and hope in that steadfast love are those who God takes pleasure in
- By God enabling us to Treasure Him more than anything He loves us the best He could love us
 - \circ $\,$ We were made in His image by God and for God $\,$
 - If He didn't enable us to live out the purpose for which we were made would not be loving
 - "You are precious to God, and the greatest gift He has for you is not to let your preciousness become your god. God will be your God. God alone forever. And this is infinite love. This is how much He makes of you." John Piper

Questions

- 5. Why do these things cause God to take pleasure?
- 6. How is the Gospel the clearest expression of Gods steadfast love?
- 7. How can we actively live inside the fear of God and hope in His steadfast love?
- 8. Why would God want us to know that He pleasures in His people? How might that affect you in the day to day?
