

# The Pattern & Power of Radical Forgiveness

Philemor

### Main Idea

The Gospel leads us into a kind of forgiveness that makes no sense without faith and love in the Lord Jesus Christ.

### Overview

# The local church is the audience, instruction, & inspiration for forgiveness

- Paul addresses Philemon, Apphia, Archippus (Col. 4.17), and "the church in your house" (vss. 1-2)
  - While the letter is addressed to all of these additional parties, the bulk of the letter is addressing Philemon:
    - All the "you's" of vss. 4-21 are 1<sup>st</sup> person singulars (addressed to Philemon)
- Meaning, Paul wanted the church to know the appeal and both encourage
  - Philemon in it as well as be encouraged (inspired) by it
- Philemon would have welcomed this audience as he loved the "saints" (vs. 4)
  - o In so doing we learn the normative pattern of God's people in a Gospel centered life:
    - The local church is the context whereby we can be spurned on and be held accountable to live faithfully ourselves

## The church is born out of Faith & Love in the Lord Jesus Christ

- Vs. 4 Paul thanks God for Philemon, because of his love and faith he has in the Lord Jesus Christ (vs. 3, 6)
  - Love: Affection or devotion towards Christ
  - o Faith: Trust, reliance, dependence, or submission to Christ
    - Put together: Paul thanks God for Philemon because he has an affection for and a trust in the Lord Jesus Christ
- The: There is only one Lord Jesus...there are not numerous Savior's
- Lord: Ruler/King/Authority
- Jesus: Savior
- Christ: Messiah or Anointed...the answer to God's promises (2 Cor. 1.20)
  - o To be in the church is to be one that has love and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ:
    - To lose any one of these pieces compromises one's assurance to salvation
  - All of this is the grounds that leads us to radical forgiveness

# Faith and Love in the Lord Jesus Christ demands radical forgiveness

- We do not know the particulars, however, it is believe that Onesimus was a runaway slave (vs. 16) who possibly stole some money (vs. 18) from Philemon:
  - He had come to faith in Christ under the ministry of Philemon (vs. 10-11)
  - He is being sent back to Philemon so that the Gospel might be dramatized for all involved (vs. 15-16)
  - Paul's appeal is that Philemon will receive him back not as a bondservant but as a beloved brother in Christ (vs. 16)
  - Paul could have used his apostolic status and told him to do it, however he wanted Philemon to do it under his own free will (vs 8, 14)
  - Paul is confident Philemon will do the right thing (vs. 21)
  - o In Philemon's joyful obedience, he would 'refresh' Paul (vs. 20)
- The Gospel is the pattern and the power to move us towards a radical forgiveness (Eph. 4.32)

• Forgiveness is a choice to absorb the payment/penalty for sin or wrong doing and clearing the debt of the guilty. It does not signify that the actions toward the forgiver were okay.

### Questions

**Discussion Starter**: Consider some instances in the lives of your group or in the news where people forgive radically.

- 1. Who all does Paul address in his letter? What's the significance of him addressing others than Philemon? How can we learn from this?
- 2. Why does Paul thank God for Philemon? What does it mean to have Faith? Love? Why do we need both?
- 3. Why do we need all four words in "the Lord Jesus [Christ]?"
- 4. How does the Gospel give us a pattern and the power to forgive radically? What is forgiveness? What is it not?
- 5. In what ways will our forgiveness indicate a beautifully counter-cultural community that is in keeping with God's love for us (John 13.35)? Why do we often not want to forgive others?
- 6. How would it have been revolutionary to not only forgive Onesimus but receive him as a beloved brother? How should this apply to Restoration Church?
- 7. In verses 7 and 21 Paul says that Philemon's obedience would be of some benefit to him and "refresh [his] heart in Christ." How and why does the joyful obedience of others bring about our refreshment?
- 8. How does this letter challenge you to live out the Gospel? How have you been refreshed by the obedience of others?

**Accountability**: Who are you needing prayer/accountability to forgive? How have you been encouraged by how Jesus forgave you? How have you been "refreshed" by the obedience of others?
