

Dishonesty & its Cause

Matthew 5.33-37

Overview

- Vs. 33: Jesus paraphrases teaching in the Old Testament:
 - Exodus 20.7: You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain
 - Leviticus 19.12: You shall not swear by my name falsely, and so profane the name of your God
 - Numbers 30.2: If a man vows and vow to the Lord, or swears an oath to bind himself by a pledge, he shall not break his word. He shall do according to all that proceeds out of his mouth
- Vs. 34-36: Jesus exposes that we have no ground to sear upon things that we cannot control
 - Don't take an oath by heaven, for it is the throne of God (not your throne)
 - Don't take an oath by earth, for it is His footstool (not your footstool)
 - Don't take an oath by Jerusalem for it is the city of the great king (not your city and your not the king)
 - Don't take an oath by your own head, you cant make one hair change color (you can't control your hair)
- Vs. 37: Jesus says you can control your integrity: Let your yes' be yes and your no's be no's
 - Having to say more than simply yes or no illustrates that our lives lack integrity:
 - Since they lack integrity they possess deception: Satan is the great deceiver (Rev. 12.9)

<u>Questions</u>

Discussion Starter: Share stories where you've seen/experienced/participated in dishonesty. And/or discuss any trades that you trust or don't trust and why.

- 1. Read Matthew 5:12-15 and 5:17-20. What is Jesus driving at in the Sermon on the Mount as a whole?
- 2. Read Matthew 5:33-37. Why are 'oaths' necessary in a post-fall world? How did they come to be? (See Gen. 3.1-7)
- 3. In what way does it appear that people were using oaths? How do we do the same thing?
- 4. What does Jesus' corrections seem to be saying about the practice?
- 5. In what ways might Jesus correct us in the way we 'swear' or take 'oaths' based off His approach to the Sovereignty of God in all things?
- 6. Read James 5:12; Proverbs 10:9; 12:19; 19:1; 28:6; Colossians 3:9-10. What do these verses tell us about the importance of truth/integrity upon our lips? Why does God want us to be full of truthfulness and consistency?
- 7. Why do we lie/deceive others?
- 8. In what way is dishonesty connected to fear of being alone and/or unaccepted? How does the Gospel address this? How does the provision of the church help?

Accountability Question: What are some ways the Lord has revealed to you that you need to have your 'Yes' be 'Yes' and your 'No' be 'No'?
