Joy Made Complete | Philippians 4:10-13

REVIEW

Paul wrote Philippians for the sake of unifying the church in the enjoyment and advancement of the gospel of Jesus Christ. Unity in the gospel births communal joy that results in the advance of the gospel to the lost. As we partner together in the gospel, the result is **joy made complete**.

In 4:10-13, Paul exemplifies unconditional satisfaction for the Philippians. While he is immensely thankful for their support of his ministry, he does not need – in the strictest sense of the word – their help because he has all that he needs in Christ Jesus.

STUDY & APPLY // PHILIPPIANS 4:10-13

- 6. How does Christ strengthen Paul in hunger and need? In times of abundance?
- 7. What does verse 13 NOT mean? What does verse 13 actually mean?
- 8. In which circumstances are you tempted to be discontented? Why? How does Christ give you strength in these areas?
- 9. What members of Restoration Church exude contentedness? How so?
